#### **Explanatory notes for Members**

#### 1). Concert income

This financial year saw a return to three concerts for the year, with no restrictions on audience numbers. As a result, our concert revenue has increased again, although it must be taken into account that the ticket sale prices also include a complementary drink for audience members, so there is no separate income stream for interval drinks, as was the case before Covid. This is to avoid the issues of multiple cash and SumUp transactions and with fewer banks now accepting cash.

The first concert, in November 2022 with Coro, was performed with a full orchestra, which meant that concert expenditure has also increased over last year.

### 2). Subscriptions/ Donations/ Friends

These all show increases over last year, due to a number of reasons:

- After remaining at the same rate of £150 PA since 2012, members subscriptions were
  increased this year to £180 PA with many members also adding an additional contribution to
  their annual subscription payments as a donation to the Chorale. In total, these came to
  £950 and we are very grateful to those members for their generosity.
- There were several more members who returned to the Chorale, having "rested" during Covid
- The chorale was also able to attract several new members this year, partly as a result of the "Come and Sing" evening held in September.

## 3). Other Donations

This year, the chorale received a donation of £500 from the estate of Pat Wood and we are very grateful for her generosity to the Chorale. This is shown as "External Donations".

Donations such as this are very welcome for the chorale's finances and we would ask members to please think about leaving a donation to the chorale in their will.

#### 4). Income Tax Recoverable (Gift Aid)

This reflects the increase in subscriptions this year, as well as some additional claims that were missed last year, having received several signed Gift Aid forms which were not to hand last year.

## 5). Fund Raising

This includes the Quiz Night that we were able to hold once again in December. The increased income also means an increase in associated expenditure.

#### 6). Website

These costs have reduced considerably as we are no longer using external consultants for this. These duties have been taken over by a chorale member at no cost.
